Registration is required to participate in storytimes and will begin on **Monday, Oct. 30 at 10:00 a.m.** A link to register on-line will be visible on the Library's home page or the Children's Program web page at 10 AM the day registration begins. If you prefer, you may also call the library at 937-667-3826 and register with a staff member at the main Circulation Desk.

Your child's age at the time of registration will determine which class you should register for. Due to space limitation you may register your child for only one Storytime. Siblings are welcome, but only the child who's age fits the Storytime should be registered.
